- 9. When was this plant introduced in Indiana or the US?
- 10. Why was this plant introduced in Indiana or the US?
- 11. What are three ways we can prevent the spread of this plant? (What can we do to get rid or prevent this invasion?)
- 12. Reward. (Be creative and realistic here. What could we do to make people remove these invasive species?)
- 13. Citation Titles of websites and URL address used.
